Use these questions in your community group time to dig deeper and discover how you can apply today's message to everyday life.

INTRODUCTION

We have a sense that our *final destination* should be, at the very least, a "dream come true" type of experience. Maybe that's why we get so bored with the idea of heaven as it is often portrayed.

But the Bible's portrayal of a new heaven and a new earth is so vast that we can hardly take it all in! We've got to stretch our imaginations, guided by the Bible, to even get a small taste of what it will ultimately be like. So today, using our God-given imaginations, under the guidance of reasonable interpretation of Scripture, we'll see if we can open our eyes a bit more and get a glimpse of what the Bible says is in store for us.

6. **Read Philippians 3:20-21 together.** Do your relationships with Jesus' people ever cause you to feel like you are "entering heaven" even now? Does it seem like your citizenship is in heaven? Why or why not?
