## study questions:

Use these questions in your community group time to dig deeper and discover how you can apply today's message to everyday life.

### Key passage: Luke 9:28-36

1. What questions did this week's message raise for you?
2. Read Luke 9:28-36 together.
  - a. What does this story reveal to us about Jesus?
  - b. Note: This story was a secret experience of the "3" for some years (v.36). Now that we've heard it, what does it tell us looking back about what Jesus accomplished?
  - c. What does the story tell us about what we can expect to happen in this world soon?
  - d. In light of 2 Peter 1:16-21, what does this show us about how sure we can be that these things are true about Jesus?
3. Putting yourself in Peter's place (and probably groggy), what do you think he was trying to do in v. 32-33? Have you ever found yourself trying to do a similar thing with Jesus? When? What?
4. Note the "cloud" (v. 35), the "flash of lightning" (v. 30), and the "glorious splendor" (v. 30)?
  - a. Though Jesus shone from within while Moses and Elijah reflected the glory of God from having been in his presence (cf. Exodus 34:29-35), what does this story with all its light tell you about the glory of God?
  - b. What are we supposed to do about God's glory and how would that work? [cf. 2 Corinthians 3:18)
5. Pray for each other and for your entire church family that we would be more and more sure of our trust in God's Word, and be able to reflect his glory each day as a result—no matter where.
